Understanding & Finding Essential Skills Profiles

Essential Skills are the skills needed for work, learning and life. They provide the foundation for learning all other skills and enable people to evolve with their jobs and adapt to workplace change. The nine Essential Skills listed by the Government of Canada are:

- reading text
- numeracy
- computer use

- document use
- oral communication
- continuous learning
- writing
- working with others
- thinking skills (problem solving, decision making, critical thinking, job task planning and organizing, significant use of memory and finding information)







Essential Skills Profiles break down specific jobs into the nine Essential Skills generally performed by workers in an occupation. They also provide complexity levels for each task, between 1 (basic) and 5 (advanced).

The Essential Skills Profiles can be used to:

- Help determine, based on skill sets, which career may best suit a particular individual.
- Assist job seekers to write a résumé or prepare for a job interview.
- Help employers to create a job posting.
